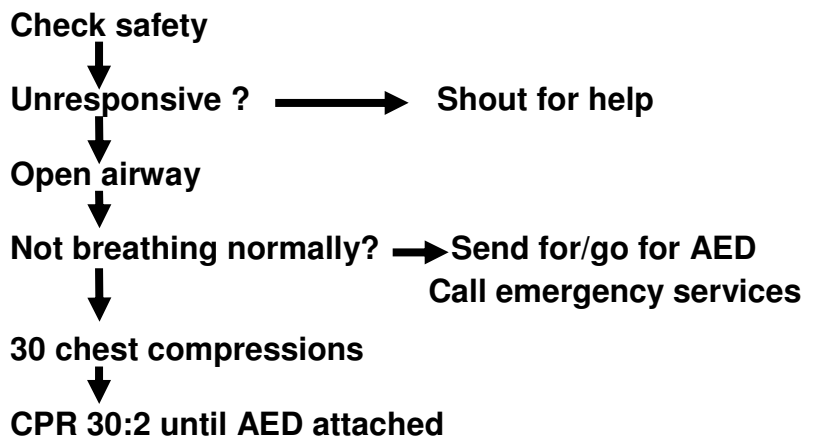

Keep the casualty quiet
 Lie casualty flat on back
 Administer 100% oxygen
 Administer fluids
